Everyone who submitted a name received a door prize.

Bird count nets 64 species

On Sunday, December 28, 22 WCAS members participated in the chapter's Christmas Bird Count and reported seeing a total of 64 species in Cleveland's West Side count area. The event was part of three-week, nationwide effort to monitor trends in bird population. Don Altemus, compiler for the chapter's count, said the count produced generally what we have seen over the years.


February Program

Tuesday, February 3 at 7:30 PM

Throughout Ohio, forest living species are having a difficult time due to fragmentation, the introduction of non-native and introduced species, and the abundance of some herbivores. Dave Swanson, of the Ohio Division of Wildlife Forest Research Group, has a method to rank the rarity of birds in forest habitats. His presentation, *"Ranking the Rarity of the State's Forest Birds"*, will discuss the methods and discover which species he considers the most rare within the state, which ones are not ... and why.



February Field Trip February 14, 2004, 8:30 a.m., Mill Creek Falls



Mill Creek Falls will be the site of our Saturday, February 14 field trip. A waterfalls that once powered a mill, Mill Creek is part of the Garfield Reservation and opened in 2002. We will tour the site and walk the towpath that connects it to Garfield Reservation. Following the tour, we will go to nearby Calvary

Cemetery to look for wintering birds. Merlins have been observed at the cemetery this winter and last winter. Meet at 8:30 a.m. in the Mill Creek parking lot off of Miles Ave.

Science Olympiad is being held on Saturday, February 28 at Cleveland State University. Your assistance will be needed from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. to set up the "Bird Identification" stations, monitor students, grade an-

swers and take down stations at the end of the day.

We may use pictures, external parts of birds , nest, eggs and songs or calls fro identification. Questions on ecological concepts as well as interpreting data may also be included.
